Abstract of the will of George Parker of the town and county of Southampton

Dated 24 October 1638 Proven 9 May 1639

To be buried in the chancel of St Laurence Church To the parish of St Michael in Southampton 10 shillings.

I give out of the tenement in East street wherein John West now liveth 5 s a year for ever to be given every Good Friday in Lent unto five old men twelve pence apiece.

To my son Robert all my free land lying in or about the Town and County of Southampton and to his heirs forever he or they paying out of the said lands unto four other of my children here under mentioned 20 pounds a piece when they attain the age of 21 years.

To my son George Parker and my three daughters Ann Parker, Elizabeth Parker and Abigail Parker 20 pounds a piece to be paid by my son Robert Parker his heirs and assigns at their age of 21. To my son John Parker and my daughter Margery Parker 20 pounds a piece at age of 21 out of the means I shall leave unto my executrix but if either or any of my children depart this life before the age of 21 then the portion of the party or parties so deceasing shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my children surviving (my son Robert excepted).

To my aunt Margery Pyke 10s to buy her a ring. To my sister Elizabeth Crompton and her daughter Elizabeth Mills, 40s a piece. To my two nieces in Cornwall by name Willmot and Mary, 50s a piece.

All other my goods, chattels, etc, whatsoever to Abigail Parker my now wife whom I make my sole executrix. My will is that my said executor shall have the managing profit, etc, of all my said free land so given unto my said son Robert Parker during his monage and when he be of full age of 21 years, then the same shall be delivered to him.

Overseers my friends Peter Clongon and Mr John Bengor of the aforesaid Town and County of Southampton and give unto them 10s a piece to buy them gloves. Moreover I give unto my cousin Margery Barlow of the city of Chichester daughter of my uncle Captain William Parker of Plymouth, 30s.

A codicil increases the number of old men to receive relief from five to six. Also that after my wide's decease my son George Parker shall have the remainder of the lease of Kings Orchard out of which he shall pay those legacies as is before ordained if my executrix shall die before the children come to age..

Will of John Parker, of Accomac County, Virginia; Dated January 9, 1692/3. Proved September 19, 1695.

"To my eldest son George Parker, 20 shillings. To second son John Parker, plantation called Mattapony, where I now live containing 400 acres after decease of my wife Amy. To son William Parker 300 acres in Pocomoke River in Somerset Co., MD., called "Winter Quarter"; also sloop called Arlington. To my son Edward Parker, 200 acres, being part of 600 acres of Mattapony Patent, as by deed of gift to him dated Dec. 21, 1692. To son Matthew Parker and to his heirs forever my plantation called "Little Gargaphia" containing 400 acres whereon Richard Hayes now lives, lying near Gargaphia in Accomack; and also half of the hummucks and marshes in Maryland to hold in Joyntenancy with his brother Thomas Parker and their heirs forever, the same being purchased of Josias Seawrd. To son Anderson Parker, 385 acres near Bloxams Bridge. To son Thomas Parker, 200 acers at the head of Messongo Branch; and that plantation which I purchased of maximilian Gore, containing 295 acres with all and singular and appurtenances to him and his heirs forever, as also the halfe of the hummucks and marshes in Murumsco in Maryland. To grandson John Ayres. To Mr. Williamson. Wife executrix (Amy Parker).

Codecil: Jan. 12, 1692/3. 200 acres of marsh, being the northernmost of Pungoteague Island not expressed in will, the said 200 acres to be appropriated to my 400 acres at Mattapony, gives same to son John Parker 200 acres of marsh by a later patent upon Pungoteague Island to the southward of the aforesaid 200 acres, which is omitted in aforesaid will, but is given as deed of gift to son Edward Parker, which 200 acres is given to Edward Parker. Wite.: William Anderson, George Hope, George Parker, Sr. "

"William Michael was perhaps the first attorney to practice his profession in Northampton County, and in 1657 was one of the recognized leaders of the bar. For many years Colonel Edmund Scarburgh seems to have shared honors with Michael. The former's argument in the famous Gettering's Controversy, which arose out of a bequest to the church by Stephen Charlton, is a masterly exposition of the law of wills.[FN1]

Other distinguished lawyers of the seventeenth century were: Thomas Harmonson, Francis Pigott; Daniel Foxcroft, John Tankard, Charles Holden, William Spencer, John Luke, Ambrose White, George Watson, John Stratton, John Parker, James Watts, and Colonel John Custis. Custis ably defended the Rev. Mr. Teackle against certain ungrounded but serious charges brought against him by Scarburgh, the latter accusing Teackle of improper relations with Lady Scarburgh and combining with her to poison him. Most of the attorneys named were exceptionally well versed in the law and skillful practitioners. The volume of litigation was surprisingly large, and while the practice of law must have been highly lucrative, yet the lawyers invariably indulged in the planting of tobacco."

This George Parker [born ca. 1700] does not descend from John Parker and Tabitha Truitt, as had been previously thought--he is a FIRST COUSIN, ONCE REMOVED to John Parker and Tabitha Truitt. John Parker and Tabitha Truitt did indeed have a son named "George," but John Parker and Tabitha Truitt's "George" is a SECOND COUSIN to this George Parker [born ca. 1700], and an entirely different individual than this George Parker [born ca. 1700].

The material below is from Darrin L. Parker, Esq. of the Eastern Shore Parker research group [written in response to fellow researcher Laurie Fowers], and is quoted by permission [03/01/2005]

[#1]

It appears that our George Parker ("Sr.", who was a millwright), father of :

Elisha George Jr. millwright who md. 1st Sarah UNK; 2nd Abigail Scroggins, Jacob who md. Mary Smith, John who md. Sarah Gordy, Sarah Parker who md. Robert Price, Mary Parker who md. James Twyford.

... NEVER RECEIVES via bequest lands named Wickenoes/Wisconis Neck, Dunifrisie, Brotherhood, Parker's Adventure NOR TAKES same by patent or indenture. These same lands are known to be those held by John Parker who md. Tabitha Truitt. According to John's will, his son George was to have received Wickenoes/Wisconis Neck and a portion of Parker's Adventure. Again, our George "Sr. millwright" is never shown TO BE IN POSSESSION of these lands.

[#2]

It appears that George Parker of Accomac Co. VA. [will written: 1708; will proved: 2 JUN 1713; whom I'll refer to as "George Parker 'Elder, millwright'" md. Mary UNK. (later married Mr. _____ Donas);] passed Mattapany to his son George, as follows:

To son George PARKER: "...my halfe of ship Rack Island the aforesaid fore hundred akers of Land, and this Island & still to him and his heirs...." *** Mount Hope - 400 Acres: "near Sammuell POWELLS, & near the head of one of St. Martin's branches, that David HUDSON dos now live...."

Compare the above will of "George Parker 'Elder, millwright'", with the abstract of the land indenture of George "Sr." millwright dated Feb. 18, 1757, which reads:

"...George Parker-of Somerset Co. Millwright & Sarah his wife of the one part & Joshua Rodgers of Worcester Co. Planter of the other part.....Tract or Parcel of Land CALLED MATTAPONY lying in Worcester County on the seaboard side near the head of St. Martin's Sound...standing on a Point on the North Side Of Herrin Creek....near unto Corner tree of a Tract of Land formerly Surveyed for Ambrose White called Happy Entrance..." (emph. added).

The above indenture and abstract appear to firmly establish the fact that St. Martin's branches is the same area as the tract Mattapany... in fact, the St. Martin's branches tract is "called Mattapany."

Our George "Sr." millwright is shown to be possession of St. Martin's branches -- this is evidenced by the 1757 transfer to Joshua Rodgers. Moreover, the abstract of said conveyance indicates that the St. Martin's branches tract was "called Mattapany."

Furthermore, the book: "Land Records of Worcester County Maryland:1666-1810" by Ruth T. Dryden shows that George Parker the "Elder, millwright patented Mattapany on Sep. 18, 1701 which consisted of 390 acres, but later found only to be 300 acres. The other book [cite omitted] referencing this same land patent revealed that Mattapany did lie on the "seaboard side on the north side Herring Creek."

The land deed/indenture, dated 1757 shows that on Feb. 18, 1757, George Parker, ["Sr."] millwright sold real property located "at head of St. Martin's River 300 acres." [Again], the abstract written in the land indenture clearly states that the real property being conveyed by George Parker, ["Sr."] millwright on Feb. 18, 1757 was the "Tract or Parcel of Land called MATTAPONY lying in Worcester County ON THE SEABOARD SIDE NEAR THE HEAD OF ST. MARTIN'S SOUND...STANDING ON A POINT ON THE NORTH SIDE OF HERRIN CREEK...." (emphasis added). Thus, both George "the Elder" millwright's and George "Sr." millwright's property consisted of tract(s) "on the seaboard side near the head of St. Martin's Sound...standing on a Point on the North Side Of Herrin Creek" consisting of "300 acres."

Thus, LANDS KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN IN THE POSSESSION OF GEORGE THE ELDER MILLWRIGHT ARE LATER SHOWN TO BE IN THE POSSESSION OF OUR GEORGE "SR."

MILLWRIGHT. When it is remembered that THIS VERY LAND had been bequeathed by "George Parker 'Elder, millwright'" to his son George, it appears that the George who was the son of George "the Elder, millwright" and George Sr. millwright were the SAME individual.

Coupled with Issue #1 (absence of Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck or portion of Parker's Adventure), this is a huge discrepancy to the "Truitt-to-George Sr." line of reasoning.

[#3]

Reciprocally, it appears that none of the lands possessed by our George "Sr." were ever possessed or referenced by John Parker who md. Tabitha Truitt.

Our George "Sr." millwright is known to have possessed Streights, Millwright's Good Intent, High Ridge, and Sawmill Supply Situate. None of these lands are referenced in connection with John Parker who md. Tabitha Truitt.

Coupled with Issues #1 (absence of Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck or portion of Parker's Adventure), and #2 (apparent bequest of Mattapany by George the Elder millwright to George Sr. millwright), this is a huge discrepancy to the "Truitt-to-George Sr." line of reasoning.

[#4]

It appears that a different George is in possession (and bequeaths) the lands known as Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck:

According to your [Laurie Fowers'] research, a George PARKER who md. Elizabeth UNK (Sons: John, Schoolfield, Ely, Samuel), writes a will Dec. 6, 1767 (proved: Sep. 16, 1774) in which the tract Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck is listed, as follows:

"I give and bequeath unto my Son John Parker all that Tract or parcel of land Called Wickenos Except what I conveyed to my Son Schoolfield Parker out of the Said Tract but it is by will and pleasure that my wife Elizabeth Parker Shall Possess and Enjoy one part of the Said Land and Benefits and Privileges of all appurtenances to the Same belonging during her natural life and afterwards to my Said Son John his heirs and assigns for ever."

Thus, the Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck tract, which should have been in the possession of our George Sr. millwright if the "Truitt-to-George Sr." theory were true, is shown to be in the possession of a DIFFERENT George. And your [Laurie Fowers'] research appeared to demonstrate that our George "Sr. millwright" is never shown to be in possession of Wickenoës/Wisconis Neck during any interim timeframe.

This seems truly FATAL the "Truitt-to-George Sr." theory This George Parker [born ca. 1700] does not descend from John Parker and Tabitha Truitt, as had been previously thought--he is a FIRST

COUSIN, ONCE REMOVED to John Parker and Tabitha Truitt. John Parker and Tabitha Truitt did indeed have a son named "George," but John Parker and Tabitha Truitt's "George" is a SECOND COUSIN to this George Parker [born ca. C 1700], and an entirely different individual than this George Parker [born ca. 1700].

Colonial Soldier, War for American Independence.

Recieved a grant of 287 1/2 acres in land for military services. The land was in Washington County, GA on the Oonce River. Grant was made in 1784, the same year Washington County was created from indian lands. John raised Samual who eventually married his daughter Mary Polly. Johns military record includes the following Apr 1776. On muster roll Capt Thomas Hollandunder Command John Haslett Apr 1777. On payroll Capt James Moore May 1777, On payroll Capt Jon Learmouth, formerly Capt Pope's company. Nov 1777 on muster roll Capt James Moore. May 1778 on payroll Capt James Moore's Company under Lt John Wilson. Jun 1778 on Payroll Capt John Learmouth, formerly Capt

Pope's Company. Oct 1778 on payroll Capt John Patten (Parten).

10 Jul 1784 Georgia signed Land Grants to Revolutionary Soldiers, including John Parker. 16 Sep 1784 John Parker sold "Snow Hill" in Worchester County, Maryland. 23 Sep 1784 John Parker claimed the assigned 287 1/2 acres in Georgia, bounded SW by the Oconee River, SE by Charles Curtis' land, all other sides vacant.

Samual, the son of George Parker, was at least partially raised by his uncle, John Parker. Upon the death of his father, Samual lived with John until John took up the land grant in Georgia. At this time 1787, Samual sold the land called "Snow Hill" located in Worchester County MD, which had been left to him by his father. At this time he went to Georgia and bought land next to his uncle John. This land, purchased from Sanders Walker consisted of 500 acres and cost him \$100.00 It was located near Rock Creek Landing on the Oconne river. The land was located in Washington, Greene & Hancock depending on current county lines. The following was written but by who is unknown "Like many other Greene County Georgia families, the Parkers participated in land sales at nearby Milledgeville GA in 1817-1819. They joined the migration into what is now Escambia Co, Ala. At that time it was a part of Baldwin and Conecuh Counties and was still occupied by Indians. The Parkers settled in the area that became the Roberts community. It was located just East of what is now Brewton, the county seat of Escambia, which county was established in 1868. They and their neighbors began to wrestle a bare existence from that wilderness. With few tools and no nails they constructed log houses, rail fences, rough barn and animal sheds. They cleared enough of the land to plant the necessary food stuffs for man and his beasts. The Conecuh River was their link with the outside world at Ferry Pass and Pensacola. These pioneers struggled, barehanded, with the wilderness, the terra in and the elements with varying degrees of success for five years. After experiencing these almost unsurmountable inconveniences and with ever increasing hostilities from the Indians, the Parkers returned to their holdings in Georgia where they remained only two years. Once again they ventured back to their lands in South Alabama.

Mary Parker had three sisters and two brothers older than she. At the time of John's enlistment Mary was not quite two years old and she had three younger brothers born in 1778, 1789 and 1782 before the armistice was made final in 1783. A family tradition accepted and recorded by each genealogist of the Parker Family states that Samuel who married his first cousin, Mary, Came over to this Uncle John as an orphan boy and was reared by that Uncle. I believe, with many others that when John's brother, George Parker, died in Worchester County Maryland, John Parker took his nephew, Samuel, born in Worchester County and reared him. When Samuel's uncle John moved to Georgia he joined them there after selling in 1787, the land that was left to him by his father, George Parker, In Worchester County Maryland. He bought property next to his Uncle John in Washington Co Ga., 10 Aug. 1790. He married his cousin, Mary, in Georgia in 1792. (This marriage date is of record only in old family letters and bibles.)

Belle Parker lived with her family when in approximate 1906 they moved from Brewton, Escambia, AL, to Leakesville, Greene, MS. At the time her father was in logging. In approx 1915 they moved to Moss Point and bought a restaurant. Later in 1919 they moved to Pascagoula where they lived in a house on Telephone Road, next to the Baptist Church. Belle returned to Mobile with her sister where they were employed by George Pressenos in his restaurants. Her sister Lene would marry George. In the meantime her parents had accepted a position in the delta region of Mississippi, to run a boarding house for a lumber camp. She was asked to come as they needed her help. Lene went with her on the train and while riding they took notice of a young man sitting across the aisle. Upon arrival the superintendent of the logging camp was waiting for them and apparently, the young man they had been discussing on the train. As they got into the car he was introduced to them as Mr. Harry Parent. Life in the lumber camp was rather simple and Belle saw a lot of Harry. In fact Harry often helped out in the kitchen, something he learned at his mother's boarding house. Soon Harry asked Belle to marry him, much to the displeasure of her mother. At this Belle returned to Mobile to stay with Lene and her husband George, but additional plans had been made. She took a train to Vicksburg, MS where she met Harry. He had an agreement with a friend, and they were married in the Catholic Church at Vicksburg, MS.

Belle Parent was living Tempary at 5275 11th St. (at the residence of Florence Parent & Ralph Bordelon) Katy, TX, where she died between 2 & 5:30. She died in her sleep and her head was resting in her left hand as if just resting. She had a glass of tea a little before 2 p.m.. Florence Parent and Ralph Bordelon and Paul Parent were at the house when she died.

Harry William Parent lived with his parents near Lakeland, LA, on a cotton plantation. When he was about seven, in about 1890 the crops were wiped out by weevils so his father, Henry, moved the family to New Roads.

At the age of ten or eleven he and brother Alphonse would wash bottles and fill them. With fourmular, he and his brothers delivered soda pop to stores around the island. This normally took all day and occasionally they had to spend the night away from home. Harry and his brothers learned to swim in the Mississippi River. Their mother would tie a rope around their waist and they could swim the length of the rope.

After moving to Garyville, Mr Parent went to high school. Because of tutoring he was too advanced for his class and left high school to enter Baton Rouge Business College which he completed in 1912 at the age of 18.

Harry William Parent, Army Serial No. 1609622, served as a sergeant of Company A. Development Battalion, Camp Beuregard, LA, United States Army. He served from 29 May, 1918 until 9 Mar 1919.
